The Education Foundation made it through a full season of pandemic protocols and hurdles in a surprisingly fine fashion. Although the number of donors was about half of that in 2019/20, we received the **second largest donation total** in the last five seasons! Through all the unknowns, the one constant was the generous donors of the Education Foundation. Because of them, we were optimistic and ready to give a record number of scholarships as well as support to the Division's premier events.

Though the number of donors were down from last year, the number of contributions between \$100 - \$249 was 40% higher. There were also more donations in the \$250 to \$499 and \$25 to \$49 range than in 2019/20. **This just indicates how amazing and generous our donors are.** Interestingly, the most contributions came during the first quarter, July – September, traditionally the lowest months during our fiscal year.






Featured Members


